

Muchea Cattle Report 03/08/2026

1332 liveweight and 17 veal / total 1349

Today's sale had a very mixed yarding ranging from well presented finished trade animals to big lines of both local and pastoral weaners. Store local and pastoral cows were abundant and a run of Angus and Murray grey cow and calf units selling from \$1700 to \$2700/head.

Most categories were firm to slightly cheaper with young bulls being the exception, gaining 80/100c/kg.

Local weaner steers were sporadic at times selling from 340c to 622c while weaner heifers eased 10/15c starting from 250c and sold up to 524c/kg. Local yearling steers were all over 350kgs and returned 400c to 526c while yearling heifers were selling from 320c to 512c/kg. Pastoral steer calves sold from 258c to 442c while yearling steers ranged from 236c to 462c/kg. Pastoral heifer calves depending on condition made 170c to 442c and the same for yearling heifers selling from 150c to 430c/kg.

Grown steers returned 300c to 450c while grown heifers made 376c to 454c/kg. Light framed pastoral store cows sold from 80c to 242c while bigger framed store cows made 250c to 280c easing 15/20c/kg. Medium weight cows returned 270c to 336c and most heavy cows sold from 300c to 360c with one Romagnola selling to 390c/kg.

Young bulls lifted today by as much as 100c with restockers paying from 220c up to 472c while shipping bulls realized 486c/kg. Heavy bulls eased 25/30c selling from 262c to 336c/kg.
