

Muchea Cattle Report 07.09.2026

1214 liveweight

Today's sale was lighter in number and with the exception of several lines of excellent Angus steers, heifers and cows, quality was generally lighter in the weaner lines. This was reflected in the sale with local steers and heifers easing 25/30c/kg. Pastoral calves started off firm in pricing to last week but values tailed off as the sale progressed. With a full buying field the cow market was strong and gained 5/7c as did heavy bulls lifting 8/10c/kg.

Local weaner steers were selling from 320c to 524c while weaner heifers started from 280c and sold up to 484c/kg. Local yearling steers were all over 370kg in weight and ranged from 350c to 520c while yearling heifers were selling from 308c to 450c/kg. Pastoral steer calves sold from 332c to 478c while pastoral heifer calves returned 180c to 350c/kg. Pastoral yearling steers ranged from 214c to 444c and pastoral yearling heifers sold from 120c to 364c/kg.

Grown steers returned from 244c to 400c while grown heifers returned 332c to 416c/kg. Light framed pastoral store cows sold from 132c to 250c while bigger framed store cows made 260c to 310c/kg. Medium weight cows returned 300c to 342c and heavy cows sold to a top of 352c/kg.

Young bulls to restockers and live export ranged from 250c to 434c while heavy bulls returned 298c to 350c/kg.
