

Muchea Sheep Report 08.09.2026

Yarding 5,711/ sheep 2,891 / lambs 2,820

Around 2000 New season lambs in the yarding lifted numbers this week as well as 870 old season lambs and approximately 2900 older sheep. The buying field was attended by the usual gallery of processors along with several restockers and a return of another feedlot buyer. New season lambs with weight enjoyed gains of up to \$10/head as did heavy mutton while old season lambs across the board were cheaper again by \$12/15/head.

New season store lambs were selling from \$81 to \$178 while light lambs were making \$164 to \$200/head. Trade weights up to 22kg cwt sold from \$200 to \$247 and heavy lambs gained \$8/10 to return \$237 to \$280/head.

Old season lambs were cheaper again this week with stores starting from \$87 to \$150 while light lambs made \$122 to \$185/head. Trade weights returned \$180 to \$214 and heavy lambs from \$220 to \$262, easing \$10/12/head.

There were some very light framed Merino wether hoggets selling from \$98 to \$170 while heavier wether hoggets sold to a top of \$230/head. Store Merino ewe hoggets were making \$140 to \$160 and heavy weights also sold to a top of \$230/head. Crossbred hoggets showing finish returned \$180 to \$250 and younger rams sold to a top of \$229/head.

Plain light framed ewes sold from \$100 to \$140 while bigger framed boning ewes were making \$160 to \$191/head. Medium weights returned \$190 to \$241 and heavy ewes gained \$8/10 selling from \$240 to \$272/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$190 to \$255 while mature rams sold from \$90 to \$185/head.
