

Muchea Sheep Report 28/07/2026

Yarding 11,709/ sheep 1,823 / lambs 9,886

Lamb supply increased by 6500 for a yarding just short of 10000 head, while sheep numbers doubled to around 2000 head at Muchea today. The sale started off slowly at first and gained momentum as it progressed with the spike in values from last week levelling off to former values with store lambs easing by \$15/20 and trade lambs back \$10/15 while extra heavy lambs gained slightly in values mostly on quality. Mutton also eased \$15/20 across the board while new season lambs were limited in number and weight.

New season store lambs sold from \$133 to \$193 while trade weights returned \$214 to \$270/head.

Old season store lambs eased \$15/20 starting from \$107 up to \$196 while light lambs made \$152 to \$231/head. Trade weights were back \$10/12 selling from \$180 to \$245 while heavy lambs 22/26/kg cwt sold from \$220 to \$289/head. Lambs with cwt's over 26kg were firm to slightly dearer selling from \$283 to \$320 while heavy ram lambs returned \$249 to \$368 with one exceptional pen realizing \$406/head.

Merino wether hoggets sold from \$184 to \$250 with a skin while Merino ewe hoggets were making \$168 to \$220/head. Heavy Crossbred hoggets returned \$210 to \$250 and younger rams sold to a top of \$242/head.

Boning ewes were making \$151 to \$181/head. Medium weights returned \$172 to \$250 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$282/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$225 to \$260 while mature rams sold from \$80 to \$202/head.
