



MUCHEA SHEEP AND LAMB REPORT 13/9/22

Yarding 5,876 up 1,023/head

Numbers were up for a mainly good quality yarding dominated by old season lambs with new season lamb numbers increasing each week. Buyers were selective pushing prices down on all categories with the exception of light weight dorper lambs and entire male lines which gained with demand. The new season lambs sold to a top of \$150 while old season lambs sold to \$126/head. Heavy mutton eased with demand with best ewes making \$135/head.

Airfreight weight lambs made from \$63 to \$91, trade weights sold from \$65 to \$113 and heavier lambs made \$79 to \$126 for old season lines. Ram lambs gained making from \$62 to \$121 mainly to export. Young Merino wethers and ewes sold from \$62 to \$115/head.

Store ewes sold from \$60 to \$95, prime medium weight ewes returned \$80 to \$126 & heavy ewes sold for \$120 to \$135 /head. Mature rams gained returning \$40 to \$172 to exporters & processors.
