

MUCHEA CATTLE SALE 19/9/22

Yarding - 2,060 -up 1,225

Numbers were up with the yarding dominated by young heifers including a large run of Droughtmaster and cross yearling pastoral heifers from the same vendor which sold to 454c/kg. All categories of cows and the heavy bulls eased with less demand from processors due to the forthcoming public holidays creating short kill weeks. A pen of weaner steers topped the market at 530c/kg.

Local bred weaner steers sold from 455c to 530c while weaner heifers made 390c to 458c for local bred lines and pastoral heifers returned 250c to 442c /kg. Local bred yearling steers made 430c to 510c and yearling heifers sold for 320c to 454c & pastoral lines made from 240c to 454c for the quality lines.

Grown steers including pastorals made from 300c to 438c to processors and feeder buyers picked up the lighter weights for 294c to 470c/kg. Grown heifers sold to for 300c to 440c/kg.

Heavy prime cows eased 55c at 250c to 298c while medium weights made 244c to 294c /kg. Store cows sold for 220c to 266c /kg.

Heavy bulls made from 256c to 334c, down 16c while medium weights sold from 220c to 350c, and light weight bulls returned from 280c to 474c depending on quality.
