



MUCHEA CATTLE SALE 10/10/22

Yarding- 1,288– up 156 head

Numbers were up for mainly good quality yarding dominated by pastoral bulls and females. Another week of quality cows were offered but prices eased 20c with heavy cows topping at 340c /kg.

Local bred weaner steers sold from 500c to 544c while weaner heifers made 395c to 474c for local bred lines and pastoral heifers returned 350c to 380c /kg. Local bred yearling steers made 450c to 520c and yearling heifers sold for 388c to 468c & pastoral lines sold from 280c to 434c /kg.

Bullocks weighing over 750kg made 338c to 346c while lighter weights made from 320c up to 468c for a donated steer to benefit the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation sold for 468c /kg generously purchased by Borrello Beef. Grown steers including pastorals weighing under 600kg sold from 240c to 384c /kg. Grown heifers made 276c for pastoral lines up to 392c for heavy local bred heifers.

An excellent run of heavy prime cows sold for 272c to 340c while medium weights made 300c to 324c /kg. Store cows eased 30c selling for 100c to 296c /kg.

Heavy bulls were back selling from 240c to 302c while medium weights sold from 220c to 384c and light weight bulls returned from 220c to 545c depending on quality.
