



MUCHEA CATTLE SALE 31/10/22

Yarding – 2,033– up 628head

An increase in numbers at Muchea today with 2033 in total with a similar line up to last week. Although Local cattle were slightly more prominent this week pastoral cattle dominated the bulk of the sale. Quality was very mixed throughout with a full gallery of buyers active today and prices remain equal.

Local vealer steers sold from 486c to 526c, and vealer heifers made up to 478c/kg. Local yearling steers returned 336c to 550c and young steers to restockers selling from 240c to 310c/kg. Local yearling heifers sold up to 474c, store pastoral heifers made 150c to 330c and heavier pastoral heifers were selling from 330c to 452c/kg.

Bullocks were making 278c to 364c. Grown steers selling up to 434c and better grown heifers sold from 346c to 394c/kg. Light weight cows were making 150c to 260c, medium cows selling up to 318c while heavy cows returned up 338c/kg.

Light bulls made up to 518c to restockers, Shipping bulls were selling from 250c to 480c, and Mature heavy bulls sold up to 320c/kg.
