



## **MUCHEA SHEEP AND LAMB REPORT 4/10/22**

Total Yarding: 5,950 Up 3,493 head - Sheep: 2,775 Lambs: 3,175

Numbers were up for a mainly good quality yarding. Prices fluctuated with processors selective and only requiring limited numbers. New season lambs sold to a top of \$161 while the heaviest old season returned \$120/head. Restockers showed more interest for Young Merino lines and quality ewes. Heavy ewe mutton sold to \$130 carrying a fleece while extra heavy wethers with a good skin sold to \$178 to top the sale.

New season light weight lambs made from \$45 to \$76, Airfreight weights made \$70 to \$107, trade weights sold from \$98 to \$140 and heavy weights returned \$128 to \$161/head. Ram lambs made from \$62 to \$123 for the heaviest. Young Merino wethers sold from \$44 to \$110 for light weights and \$95 to \$121 for the heavier lines. Young Merino ewes made from \$74 to \$144/head.

Store ewes sold from \$10 to \$83, prime medium weight ewes returned \$84 to \$125 & heavy ewes sold for \$102 to \$130 with a fleece. Mature rams sold from \$20 to \$127 to processors.
