



MUCHEASHEEP AND LAMB REPORT 11/10/22

Total Yarding: 7,9443 Up 4,493 head - Sheep: 4,181Lambs: 3,262

Numbers were up for a mainly good quality yarding dominated by ewe mutton. The extra numbers of ewes resulted in a drop of \$15 to \$20 on all weight categories with processors very selective and restockers picking up some good quality breeders. New season lambs eased with demand topping at \$148 to finish \$15 down on last week.

New season light weight lambs made from \$46 to \$91, Airfreight weights made \$68 to \$98, trade weights sold from \$90 to \$116 and heavy weights returned \$124 to \$148/head. Ram lambs made from \$20 to \$94 in a diverse range of weights. Young Merino wethers sold from \$50 to \$100 for light weights and \$92 to \$117 for the heavier lines. Young Merino ewes made from \$75 to \$116 for the heavier weights.

Store ewes eased selling from \$10 to \$85 with a fleece, prime medium weight ewes returned \$51 to \$120 & heavy ewes sold for \$80 to \$138 with a fleece. Mature rams were down \$40 with minimal demand selling from \$20 to \$69 to processors.
