



MUCHEASHEEP AND LAMB REPORT 25/10/22

Total Yarding: 3,305–Down 291 Sheep: 1,904Lambs: 1,401

Numbers were similar to last week with 291 less for a total of 3305. There were some very well-presented new season and old season heavy lambs on offer which was reflected in the slight rise in price however prices were firm across all categories. Quality was mixed with very good lambs and mutton to runs of plainer types in both categories. A full gallery of regular buyers were present as well as some extra restocker buyers.

New season store lambs made from \$30 to \$75/hd. Airfreight weight lambs were selling from \$60 to \$105 while Trade lambs returned \$84 to \$136/hd. Heavy new season lambs sold up to \$150 and heavy old season lambs returned up to \$152/hd.

Merino wether hoggets sold from \$55 up to \$118 for better types while plainer Merino ewe hoggets returned from \$50 to \$139 for the better quality. Xb hoggets sold up to \$128 and younger rams were selling to \$92

Boner ewes made \$30 to \$65/head, medium weight ewes were selling up to \$115 and heavy ewes returned up to \$137 with 75mm of wool. Mature rams sold from \$10 to \$80.
